Here are this week's challenges which ask you to use some of the skills and knowledge you have learned about so far.



### Task 1 - Geography

#### LO: to draw a scale map of a location

- 2. The link above also shows you how to make a map of a room. Choose a room in your home (it doesn't have to be your bedroom) to make a map of. Try to keep it to scale you might like to print out some squared paper if you don't have any already and choose whether it would be best to use a key or label objects to show what they are.
- 3. Think carefully about everything we have learned this term. How many of your skills can you show off through your room map? Think about:
  - Compass rose (showing North, South, East and West)
  - Grid references (You could write some questions to test our skills!)
  - Symbols and keys



Task 2 - Geography

### LO: to draw a map from an aerial photograph

We would like you to create a 'treasure map'!

1. Choose a real place that you can visit (ideally a nearby park or your garden, but indoors is ok if you can't get outside) where you can

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hide some treasure (this could be a small toy, a bag of sweets or anything else you'd like to use).

- 2. Find an aerial photograph of your chosen location. Choosing the satellite option in Google Maps and zooming in on your chosen place is usually an easy way to do this.
- 3. Use your aerial photograph to create a treasure map! Copy carefully from the photo so your map is drawn to scale. Add a compass rose to show which way is north and use symbols carefully to make the features on your map clear. Remember to put an 'x' to mark the spot where you plan to hide your 'treasure'!
- 4. Hide your treasure in the position marked on your map then find someone to go treasure hunting! Can they use your map to work out exactly where the treasure is?
- 5. If you'd like more practise using your map, ask someone to hide some treasure for you to find next.
